



Wendy Anuwe was born in Taiwan and received her bachelor of fine arts degree from Taipei National University of the Arts. Mrs. Anuwe was awarded a scholarship to study at the University of North Texas in Denton, Texas, where she received her master of music degree. Mrs. Anuwe started her music study at the age of 6 when her mother introduced her to piano. At age 11, she became fascinated with the violin, which she has developed a forte and passion for.

Mrs. Anuwe has won several competitions, including first prize at the 1994 National Violin Performance Competition, and second prize at the 1992 National Piano Performance Competition in Taiwan. Mrs. Anuwe has also made many appearances as a violinist with the Taipei County Symphony Orchestra, Bach Chamber and Yin-Chi (Christian Fellowship Symphony) orchestras in Taiwan, and the Taipei Philharmonic Orchestra. Mrs. Anuwe has performed in the National Institute of the Arts Symphony Orchestra, University of North Texas Chamber Orchestra, Light Opera of Denton Texas, the Chamber Music International, and at former Dallas Cowboy, Emmitt Smith's, wedding in 2000.

A much sought-after artist, Mrs. Anuwe lives in Arlington and is the orchestra coordinator for Cedar Hill ISD where she pioneered the orchestra program for the district. She also started the orchestra program in 2003 at The Oakridge School in Arlington where she taught string orchestra for 5 years. Mrs. Anuwe has been credited with her students winning numerous regional and state string competitions. In 2006, Mrs. Anuwe received the Eisenhower Educator's Award. Mrs. Anuwe is also a member of Texas Music Educators Association and American String Teachers Association.
